Which birds count – Any species encountered in accordance with ABA recording rules

Categories – We will have 4 levels for participants. Advanced, intermediate, non-county resident and teams. Participants may choose which category they choose to join.




- 1. A team can be 2+ participants
- 2. All team members can also participate in the individual categories, but a participant can only be on one team.
- 3. Team participants don't have to always be together to see birds for the competition.
- 4. But in order for birds to count for the team effort, 95% of the birds have to eventually be observed by all team participants for them to count.
- 5. In the 5% of birds not seen by all participants, they have to be seen by at least 2 team members for them to count.




Reporting – We encourage participants to enter species into eBird, however, recording is on the honor system and can be done by any means an individual may choose.



Sharing information – This is entirely up to the individual. However, if you find a rare bird and are willing to share that information with others, do so via eBird, Sjbirds or any other means that will get the word out.


